FAMILY PARTNERSHIP TRAINING	5 days 8:45am - 5:00pm	\$1550	The Family Partnership model has been widely implemented around the world and is the basis for many successful early intervention programs for families. The model assists practitioners to develop highly respectful relationships with parents. Participants are assisted to understand what it really means to work in partnership with families and reflect on their knowledge, skills and confidence.
KEYS TO CAREGIVING	1 day 8:45am - 5:00pm	\$315	Keys to Caregiving is a video based learning program from NCAST-AVENUW at the University of Washington School of Nursing and Centre for Human Development and Disability. This interactive workshop incorporates video review and skills practice. Participants will be encouraged to reflect on how the concepts in Keys to Caregiving align with their current practice and to consider potential applications.
PLAYSTEPS	1 day 8:45am - 5:00pm	\$720	PlaySteps is a parent and child play-based program helping parents to strengthen their relationship and interactions with their child while learning practical parenting skills and building local support networks. This program is evidence-informed and has been proven to be an effective program.
NCAST - TEACHING	3 days 8:45am - 5:00pm	\$1485	The Parent-Child Interaction (PCI) Teaching Scale is a widely used scale for measuring parent-child interaction. The scale contains a well-developed set of observable behaviours that describe the caregiver-child communication and interaction during a teaching situation, birth to 36 months of age. Teaching scores from interactions with children as young as 3 months of age show a significant correlation with subsequent measures of attachment, resilience and cognitive abilities.
NCAST - FEEDING	3 days 8:45am - 5:00pm	\$1485	The aim of the Nursing Child Assessment Satellite Training (NCAST) is to give professionals, parents, and other caregivers the necessary knowledge and skills to provide nurturing environments for young children. The Parent-Child Interaction (PCI) Feeding Scale is a widely used scale for measuring parent-child interaction. The scale contains a well-developed set of observable behaviours that describe the caregiver-child communication and interaction during a feeding situation, birth to 12 months of age.
